A Daily Prayer

From earliest times, Christians have gathered at regular hours during each day and night to respond to God's word with praise and prayer.

These times of prayer bring a rhythm to the day, with regular opportunities to pause and reflect. They help us to look from ourselves and our tasks to a refocus on God.

You can say these prayers on your own, or in a household. They will be the prayers we use online for Facebook live.

If you are saying them with others choose who will say the light grey words and others can join in with the **bold** words.

Morning Prayer

You might like to light a candle as you begin.

O Lord, open our lips

and our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

The night has passed, and the day lies open before us; let us pray with one heart and mind.

Pause for reflection as you offer the day to God.

As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and for ever.

Amen.

The Psalm for today is be read followed by:

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.

One or more readings from the Bible (The reading(s) may be followed by a time of silence)

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not be wise in your own sight

Ask for his wisdom and do not be wise in your own sight

In all your ways follow him and he will make your paths straight

Blessed be the Lord the God of Israel, who has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty Saviour, born of the house of his servant David. 
A time for Prayer including:
